Applicants may want to include career aspirations, personal interests or other relevant factors in the essay. Additionally, please attach a current resume which includes 1) full name, 2) complete mailing address, 3) e-mail address, 4) best telephone number, 5) school name and location, 6) degree sought, 7) expected graduation date, 8) summary of your education, 9) summary of work history, and 10) other relevant experience/qualifications/references.
