Hey NCD, squeaking in a June Presidents Blog here on the last day of the month ...



President-elect Joe Conroy and I made it a goal to nominate deserving NCD members for AFS awards, and we are currently completing those nominations. Hopefully we will be able to share more good news from these efforts soon.
